# Selecting A College/University

There are over 3,000 colleges and universities in the U.S.

#### Keep the following in mind.....

- •Four- year, two-year, public, private or vocational.
- •Location.-Do you want to be close to home or far away?
- •Size.- Under 3,000 students or over 30,000 students.
- •Coed or single sex.
- •Private or public institutions.
- •Programs of study offered.
- •Sports and extracurricular activity available
- •Cost.- Do not exclude any choices because
- of high cost.
- (Sometimes expensive schools can afford
- to give you more aid).

## **COMMUNITY COLLEGES**

- Programs of 6 months to two years designed for the student to either transfer into a four-year university or go directly into the workforce.
- *Open admissions* anyone with a high school diploma or GED is admitted
- SAT/ACT not required do need to be "placed" with either SAT/ ACT or CPT (more about that
- later!)
- Vast selection of programs including Graphic Design, Music Production & Management, Fire Science Technology, Nursing and
- much more

- Mar.-May: Verification & Award letters



#### College Entrance Exams

#### What are the SAT and ACT exams?

These exams are used by colleges and universities nationwide to assess an applicant's aptitude for college-level work.

Even if you are not planning to attend a college that does not require these; it would be a good idea to have them in your records for the future.

# SAT Subject Tests

- Subject Tests (formerly SAT II) are designed to measure your knowledge and skills in particular subject areas, as well as your ability to apply that knowledge.
- Required by <u>CERTAIN</u> colleges/universities for <u>CERTAIN</u> majors.
- Offered on the <u>SAME DAY</u> as the SAT I (except for the March administration)
- You may sign to take up to (3) SAT II on the same test date.
- Registration available online at <u>www.collegeboard.com</u>

#### FEE WAIVERS...

Students who participate in Miami Dade County's free or reduced lunch program are eligible to receive fee waivers for college entrance exams <u>AS</u> <u>WELL AS</u> for college application fees! There **are** other methods a student may use to qualify for fee waivers. If you are not on free/reduced lunch and think you may qualify for another reason, please see Ms Gilman.

- Fee Waivers may be used for <u>**2 SAT**</u> exams and <u>**2 ACT**</u> exams!!!!
- Fee waiver recipients <u>may then</u> receive up to 4 college application fee waivers from SAT and 4 college application fee waivers from ACT. <u>BUT THE</u> <u>STUDENT MUST HAVE TESTED WITH A FEE WAIVER TO BE</u>
  - ELIGIBLE! Fee waivers can ONLY be used for ON TIME REGIS'
- Fee waivers can ONLY be used for <u>ON TIME REGISTRATIONS.</u> Fee waivers cannot be used for late or standby registrations.
- If a student registers with a fee waiver for a particular exam date and then <u>DOES NOT ACTUALLY TEST</u>, they will not receive their 2<sup>nd</sup> fee waiver.

#### **CPT Miami Dade Placement Test**

• At Miami Dade College – and other 2-year schools - you are exempt from the CPT if you score:

SAT I-	440 Verbal
	440 Math
ACT-	17- English
	18- Reading
	19- Math

**IMPORTANT:** Please visit <u>www.mdc.edu</u> periodically for updates and changes.

- If you don't obtain the minimum scores on the SAT, ACT or CPT, then you will be placed in remedial classes.
- Honors College will use the Writing score on the SAT and or ACT for admission.
